



The Lord's Supper



We celebrate the Lord's Supper once each month. It is a sacrament—a holy interaction between God and His people. It celebrates the spiritual union that Christians have with Christ. It is also called communion,

because it strengthens the community we share with every brother and sister who trusts in Jesus alone for salvation.

God's Word warns us that **"Whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty concerning the body and blood of the Lord."** (1 Corinthians 11:27)

We must think carefully about this. The sacrament is only for those who:

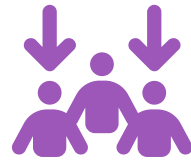
1. have examined their conscience,
2. truly understand the nature of the body of Christ,
3. have committed their entire life to following Him,
4. are baptized members of a bible-believing church.

Before you come to the table you must first come to Jesus in faith!

"If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved." (Romans 8:9-10)

Benediction



We end our worship service by receiving a blessing from God our Father. Benediction means "good word."

The blessing is from God, spoken over God's children by the pastor.

Believing in Jesus



Are you ready to start following Jesus? You can give your life to God today by trusting in Jesus for your salvation.

Here is an example of how to pray:

Dear Lord Jesus, I know that I am a sinner, and I ask for Your forgiveness. I believe that You died for my sins and rose from the dead. I turn from my sins and invite You to enter my heart and lead my life. I want to trust and follow You as my Lord and Savior. I pray in Your holy name, Jesus. Amen.

We are glad you are here! We gather to honor, celebrate, and adore God.

Christian worship is a dialogue, a conversation between God and His people. God speaks to us through scripture, sermons, and the sacraments.

We speak back to God by praying, singing, giving our tithes, and participating in the sacraments.

Worship reorients our hearts and minds to the Truth. If you are someone seeking truth, or someone struggling in mind, body, or spirit, or a follower of Jesus already—this is the place for you!



Translation

We want to make the Word of God accessible to everyone. Scripture readings, the sermon, and testimonies are translated into many languages every week.

Some translations will appear on a screen during the service. All available translations can be accessed on the tablets available in the back. If the tablet goes to sleep, turn it on using the power button. Sometimes you need to scroll up with your finger to see new content. If you need help, come to the back anytime.



Singing

Worship songs are like prayers set to music. Singing helps us encourage each another with God's

Word, to remember what is true, and lift our hearts to Him as a united family of God. The worship music at One Voice allows us to praise, pray, and proclaim truth in the different languages of our church family.

"Praise the LORD! For it is good to sing praises to our God." (Psalm 147:1)

"All the nations you made will come and bow before you, Lord; they will praise your holy name." (Psalm 86:9)

"God is Spirit, so those who worship him must worship in spirit and in truth." (John 4:24)



Apostle's Creed

This is one of the oldest summaries of what Christians believe.

Believers around the world agree on these basic truths. If you have questions about any of these things, the leaders of One Voice are happy to discuss them with you.

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended to heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy universal church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.



Prayer

Prayer is a conversation with God. We pray to remember the character of God, to confess our sins, give thanks, and to seek help. When we pray, we also open our hearts to God so He can lead and guide us by the Holy Spirit. During our time of family prayers, we share our burdens and praises with one another. Then we pray for each, in our own languages, all at the same time.



The Lord's Prayer

Jesus taught this prayer to His disciples, and we pray it together in our own languages. Here it is in your language:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever, Amen.



Testimony

Sometimes members of our church will share a story about God's work in their lives, or when they began to follow Jesus. If you have a testimony you would like to share, speak to the pastor or one of the leaders.

Children's Church



Children ages 4-9 are invited for this optional time of worship designed for them. Before the sermon begins, the children will follow leaders to their classroom. If you are new, you might want to go down with your children, so you know where to pick them up after the worship service.



Sermon

A sermon is a time of teaching from God's Word that helps us better understand ourselves and God. The Word of God is eternal and unchangeable. Sermons help us apply the Word to our lives today, so that we will think, feel, and act according to God's truth.



Offering

Giving back to God is an act of worship. When we bring our tithes and offerings to the front of the church, we are saying to God: "I thank you and I trust you!"

Tithing is good for our souls and supports Christ's church. We recognize that giving 10% of our income is the Biblical standard for giving. God has graciously and abundantly blessed us. We give Him our time, talent, and treasure as a declaration of our trust in Him to meet all our needs.

"Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the best part of everything you produce." (Proverbs 3:9)



Doxology

The Doxology is an ancient song of praise uniting all people—and the angels in heaven—in one chorus of praise to God. We usually sing it in English, then in our own languages, and then in English again. Here are the words in your language:

**Praise God from whom all blessings flow,
Praise him, all creatures all here below,
Praise him above you Heavenly host,
Praise Father, Son and Holy Ghost.**



Baptism

Baptism is a sign and seal of God's covenant of grace. The water does not remove our sins but reminds us of Christ's blood that washes away our sin. Baptism calls us to repentance, to faithfulness, and to discipleship.

We believe the sacrament of baptism replaces the Old Testament sign of circumcision (Colossians 2:11-12) and is for believers in Jesus and their covenant children (Acts 2:38). Speak to the pastor if you like to learn about baptism for you or your children.



Our Promise as a Church

We make this promise to God and to each other every week. It is based on Romans 15:5-7.

By the power of the Holy Spirit, we live in harmony with our brothers and sisters in Christ's Body. We worship and glorify God the Father together with one voice. And we welcome our neighbors as Christ welcomed us, for the glory of God.
